A Letter from the Director of Alumni Relations

Dear alumni,

In this issue of the *Alumni Connection*, we focus on one of HCC's chief strengths: educational excellence. This point is eloquently expressed by the success of our many alumni, three of whom are featured in this issue.

Sheila Donohue '81, Jerry Levinsky '73, and Susan Hall '05 each found the resources at HCC that they needed to go on to exemplary success. Sheila is now a top executive at IBM, Jerry is senior legal counsel for the Western Massachusetts office of the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, and Susan is a junior at Wellesley College. Each of them traveled a somewhat bumpy road before they came to HCC, but all of them excelled at their college studies, thanks to the support, encouragement, and talent of our faculty and staff.

Sheila's, Jerry's and Susan's stories are unique, but contain common themes that exemplify the spirit of Holyoke Community College:

- HCC puts out a "welcome mat" to people of all ages and from all walks of life. Applicants are not required to take SATs or Achievement Tests to enroll here.

- HCC's small classes provide a setting in which each student is involved in the learning process.
- HCC's faculty members are superb teachers, committed to student success.
- HCC's staff consistently "go beyond the call" to assist students whose life challenges could easily have derailed their educational ambitions.

My anecdotal sense, gathered through conversations with hundreds of alumni during the past eight years, is that more than 90 percent are satisfied with the education they received at HCC. This hunch is confirmed by the recent graduate survey, conducted by HCC'S Office of Institutional Research. For instance, in the class of 2005, 98 percent of respondents said they would recommend HCC to friends or family who are interested in attending college; 94 percent of the respondents who transferred to other colleges said they feel that HCC provided them with "good to excellent preparation" for their current college programs.

Please join me in welcoming Diana Stiles, our new director of development. In the coming weeks, many of you will have the opportunity to meet Diana, whose enthusiasm, creativity, and talent are welcomed additions to our work. Please feel free to contact Diana at (413) 552-2746.

"I'm just savoring the moment"

Long before she stepped onto the HCC campus, Susan W. Hall was dreaming about where she would finish her undergraduate education.

"I got on the mailing lists for Smith College and Mount Holyoke because they both had programs for non-traditional students. I had been getting their stuff for 15 years," says Hall, 41. "I would read through their brochures and imagine what I'd do. It allowed me to dream."

In 2005, when Hall graduated from HCC, those dreams turned into real-life choices.

The Springfield native had been accepted at both of her "dream schools" and wait-listed at a new contender: Wellesley College. Never one to take the easy road, Hall chose Wellesley.

"I was wait-listed due to deficiencies in math," says Hall, who just finished her junior year at Wellesley. "They wanted me to take college algebra, preferably pre-calculus. Just to make sure, I took them both."

Dreams and determination have always fueled Hall, a single mother who aggressively climbed the corporate ladder at AT&T and graduated as a valedictorian from HCC. But before she came to HCC, her journey through

higher education was bumpy. Her first attempt at college – after graduating from Classical High School in 1983 – stalled when she became pregnant with her daughter Whitney, now 21. Over the next two decades, Hall took classes at private and public colleges from Massachusetts to Maryland. Each time, the experience left her wanting something more.

"I never felt like I was at that place where I was going to be a part of the community, where it was all going to work," she says. "Then I came back to Springfield in 2001 and I got a course bulletin from HCC. I started reading every little thing and thinking: I can do this. I can get to where I want to go."

Inspired as she was, Hall still had her moments.

"At first, I was overwhelmed by the tests, the reading, the paper-writing, the whole college thing," she says of her first semester at HCC. She says it was her professors—Kim Hicks, Diane Beers, Mark Clinton, Don Hanover, among others—who helped her flourish.

"Mark Clinton and Don Hanover's classes really helped raise my critical thinking and writing skills," she said. "And the

Honors Colloquium was every bit as challenging as my work at Wellesley."

"I took Diane's African-American history class and loved it. She was such a great lecturer, so well prepared. Phenomenal, really. And, as a person, she really engaged me...Kim was my toughest critic as a writer. She was always asking me 'What do you mean by this?' and that made me work harder to articulate my points."

That work paid off for Hall, whose eloquence has garnered praise far beyond academia. A volunteer in Deval Patrick's 2006 gubernatorial campaign, Hall struck up an email correspondence with Patrick's wife, Diane, that continues to this day. It was one of Hall's emails—sent on the eve of the historic victory—that the governor-elect used as inspiration for his inaugural speech. In that email, Hall asked the first-lady how the Patrick administration would nurture the lessons learned during the campaign. According to a *Boston Globe* article written the day after his election, Patrick paid tribute to Hall's query:

"She (Hall) said everything I'm trying to say tonight," Patrick said.

Says Hall: "I'm just savoring the moment."

Persistence pays off

It's a lesson that many HCC students have learned: persistence pays off.

That's what Jerrold S. Levinsky discovered in 1972, when his first application to Rutgers University's Livingston College was rejected.

"I got on a bus and went to New Jersey. Completely unannounced, I walked into the admissions office and asked the director why," says Levinsky, a native of Longmeadow. "He said that to get into Livingston College from out-of-state, they were looking for students with A averages. It's not that I had failing grades, but I didn't have all As. He told me to go someplace else and apply as a transfer."

That "someplace else" was Holyoke Community College, where Levinsky's native intelligence flourished.

"I had never done that well in anything associated with math and science, but that semester at HCC, I began to see the relationship between math and ideas," he says. "I still have my course notebook from that semester. I've never let it go, because everything I've done since then is grounded in what I did that semester."

That's saying a lot.

In the 34 years since Levinsky enrolled at HCC, he has completed his undergraduate studies, earned a law degree, enrolled in a doctoral program, and taken a job at the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination (MCAD), where he now serves as senior legal counsel for the Western Massachusetts office. He has even taught college courses in law.

"I never worked so hard as I did that semester at HCC—in part out of a fear of failure, in part out of desire to learn," he says. "I had never felt so genuinely excited."

To those who know Levinsky now, that passion is a given. Whether advocating

for civil rights or debating the finer points of a jazz performance, he is rarely lukewarm. As a teen, however, he didn't always channel that enthusiasm into recognizable goals.

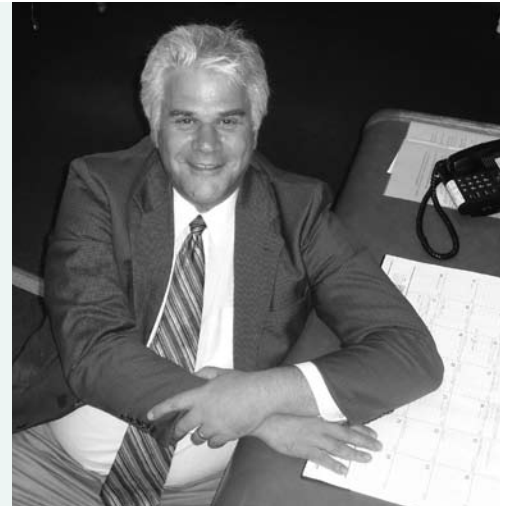
"It was the late 60s and I was full of passion for music, but not a lot else," he says of his four years at Longmeadow High School. "I had been accepted to Berklee College of Music...but if I couldn't be John Lennon and I couldn't be John Coltrane, it wasn't clear what I was going to do...my guidance counselor told me I wasn't college material."

Levinsky entered HCC in the fall of 1973, fully intending to remain for two years. His plans changed when he received his first semester grades: all As.

"I never worked so hard as I did that semester at HCC—in part out of a fear of failure, in part out of desire to learn... I had never felt so genuinely excited."

Transcript in hand, Levinsky made another unannounced trip to the admissions office of Livingston College. The scene was like an out-take from the *Wizard of Oz*:

"I pulled out the grade report from HCC, and, as the admissions director was looking at it, I said 'I can do this,'" Levinsky recalls. "This was the same guy I'd seen before. He was half-smiling, but he was probably thinking 'This guy is nuts.' Then he said their policy was to only accept transfers coming in at two years. I said, even more emphatically 'But this is where I want to go, and I can do this.' He said he would hand my transcript to the admissions officers."

Levinsky headed back to Western Massachusetts, disappointed but undeterred. He would finish his studies at HCC before making another trip to New Jersey.

He had settled into the long wait when, a week later, the letter arrived.

"Congratulations. You are hereby invited to join..."

Levinsky's voice trails off as he recites, verbatim, the acceptance letter he received from Livingston College more than three decades ago. It was an honor well-deserved, but, at the time, it felt like a gift.

"I only stayed at HCC for a semester, but I always tell people I am a grad," he says. "The confidence I gained here is something I never had before and it's something I never lost."

"I got what I needed"

Sheila M. Donohue doesn't harbor regrets, but the IBM executive does have what you might call "retroactive fantasies."

"I wish I'd taken another year at Cornell and completed the business/JD program," says the 1981 HCC graduate. "They had a combined program, and it's just another year. Think of what I could have done."

Think, *indeed*.

In the 26 years since she graduated from HCC, Donohue has completed an undergraduate degree in European intellectual history at Mount Holyoke College, earned a juris doctorate from Cornell University, and nimbly climbed the corporate ladder at IBM, where she now serves as the senior negotiator for global contracts.

But Donohue, who only recently returned from a three-year work assignment in Paris, doesn't live in the past. Neither, too, does she suffer idleness gladly.

"I'm very goal-oriented person. When I don't have a goal, I feel like I'm floundering," she says. "I already had the plan when I came to HCC. College was something I already knew I was going to do."

That determination was evident from an early age, when Donohue, one of seven children, began hatching "the plan."

"When I was in grade school I had a little blue pamphlet that had biographies of each of the presidents," she says. "I said to myself 'I don't know what a lawyer is, but if you are a lawyer, you get to be president.' I always kept that in mind."

A top student, Donohue was well on her way to realizing that goal when, as a high school senior, she met and married her husband. Two children and a divorce followed in fairly quick succession. At 22, when her high school classmates were graduating from college, Donohue was waitressing at the Mountain Laurel, juggling two toddlers as a single parent.

"I'm very goal-oriented person... I already had the plan when I came to HCC. College was something I already knew I was going to do."

"People (customers) were always saying 'What's a smart girl like you doing in a place like this?'" says Donohue. "I was thinking the same thing. I thought I'd ruined all of my chances, that there was no way to get back on track."

Donohue didn't stew very long. By 1978, she had convinced administrators at Enrico Fermi High School to schedule a GED test, which she aced in one try. Though the tests were normally graded by computer, Donohue's test had a handwritten note on it: "highest score ever."

Sheila Donohue was back on "the plan."

That fall, Donohue enrolled in a cultural anthropology class at HCC "just to see if I could do it."

"I realized I hadn't changed at all," she says. "I was a good student in high school and I saw that I could be a good student in college."

For Donohue, the key to college success was support. At home, she received that support from an extended family that helped her with childcare. At HCC, she found it in the classrooms, where teachers fed her nascent curiosity and encouraged her ambitions. She refers to the late Miriam Sajkovic as her "unofficial advisor" because the two often chatted about Donohue's dream of transferring to Mount Holyoke College. Donohue never took a class with Sajkovic, however.

"If there were support programs at HCC then, I didn't have time for them. I was constantly going - to work, to classes, to see my children," she says. "But everyone was so supportive that I got what I needed."

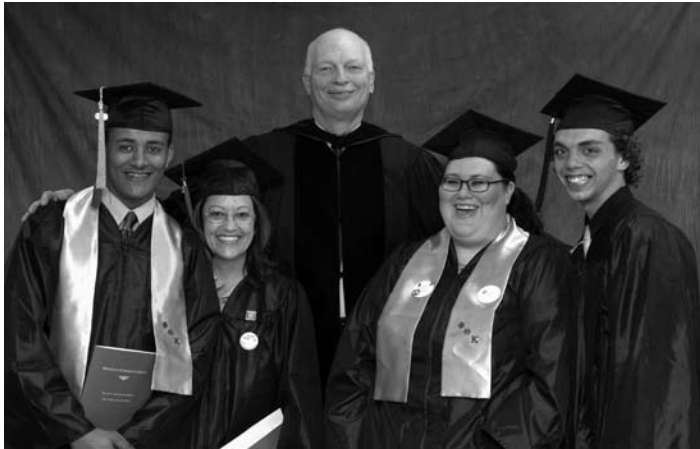

Alumni Letters



John Burgess '68

I was a student at HCC for only one year, 1967-68, and had classes with Dr. Sajkovic for both semesters before transferring to Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service. Both in my later studies and in my 25 years as a U.S. Foreign Service Officer, the lessons

I learned from Dr. Sajkovic, outside the classroom as much as inside, have stayed with me. They have, in fact, given direction not only to my career but to all aspects of my life. More than anyone else, Miriam Sajkovic taught me to think, to feel, to think about feeling.

I regret that I did not stay in touch with Dr. Sajkovic much beyond a few years after leaving HCC. I last saw her in 1970, when I paid a call to my then-fiancee. Dr. Sajkovic told me that she thought she was "a keeper." She was right, of course. My year at HCC was one of the most intellectually stimulating years I've ever had, anywhere. This was due, in large part, to the stimulation and excitement brought by teachers like Dr. Sajkovic and the late Herbert Michaels. I was lucky enough to get in touch with Dr. Michaels a few weeks before he died. I regret I did not have that chance with Dr. Sajkovic.

I was fortunate enough to have Miriam Sajkovic as my professor for Philosophy 101. Mrs. Sajkovic posed the question, "How many angels can dance on the head of a pin?" to the class as an assignment. After a couple of weeks of receiving wrong answers (like, "an infinite number") and befuddlement from the class, Professor Sajkovic finally went through her answer, step by step. "Her brilliant answer, though complex, made perfect sense. Unfortunately, I can't remember what her answer was, but I would like to! 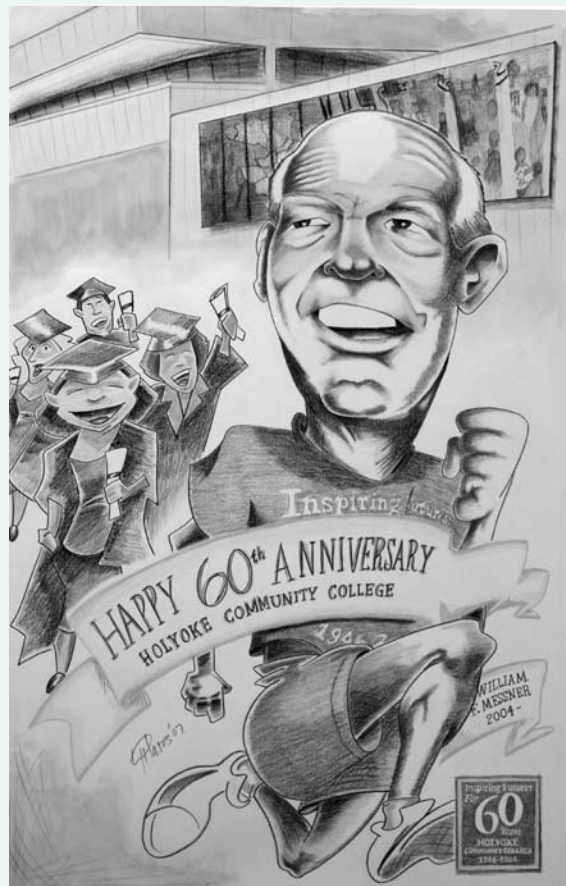
